Superintendent – Rick Durham

As we enter fall and winter, this time of year brings the potential frost delays. A frost delay will occur when frost forms on the turf canopy (putting surfaces) and temperatures are near or freezing. Turf can sustain injury simply by walking across frosted areas. When this occurs, it can be months before the injured area will recover or begin repair. During this time of year, no course setup will be completed until the frost has melted on the turf canopy. Once the conditions are safe for the putting surfaces and other areas of the golf course to begin maintenance the team will expedite course set up and release play. Fallen leaf cleanup can be a slow process. The maintenance team is working daily to complete leaf cleanup. Just as it takes months to recover from frost injury cart traffic damage on dormant Bermuda can take even longer. There will be more projects that will be underway this month. We will continue renovating bunkers, removing trees, limbing trees and tee renovations. I would like to thank everyone for the positive comments and encourage everyone to fill out comment cards. Growing up in Cincinnati, Ohio, I never really participated in competitive sports. My athletic endeavors were limited to casual tennis matches with my best friend at the local community courts and the occasional round of miniature golf, where I relished the silly windmills and colorful obstacles. Golf wasn't even on my radar until I married my hus-

band, Tom.

Once our daughters were old enough to stay home alone, Tom unearthed the golf clubs he had tucked away years earlier out of frustration and I invested in a \$100 beginner's set. We started to carve out time each week to play nine holes at various city courses on the flat prairie lands of Lafayette, Indiana. A worm-burner can roll far on flat land. As we navigated the courses, I found that golf was more than just a sport; it was a chance to laugh at our mis-hits, to celebrate small victories, and to create cherished memories under the sun.

When I first became an elementary school principal, my superintendent, Sister Lois Ann Meyers, welcomed me with open arms. She quickly took me under her wing, introducing me to the finer points of golf etiquette so that we could play together at local school fundraisers. Before long, she invited me to join a 9-hole league she loved. For years, my regular foursome included two nuns—Sister Lois Ann and Sister Rosemary, another principal—along with my husband, Tom, and me. On the course, we made far more laughs than pars, filling those rounds with stories, teasing, and occasional cheers for a rare, lucky shot.

After my husband passed away, moving to the Chicago area to be closer to my daughters was a bittersweet transition. Joining a golf league in Naperville turned out to be a wonderful way to meet new friends, giving me a sense of community and a comforting new routine. Now, as a member of the Wildflowers in Raleigh, I'm embracing the challenge of my first 18-hole league. The course's undulating landscape has added a whole new challenge to my game.

Golf has always been a social experience for me—a chance to be outdoors, stay active, and soak up the sunshine. While I'm out on the course, I'm fully present, free from the mental to-do list that usually waits at home. The joy I feel while playing golf today is the same simple enjoyment I found years ago with miniature golf.

Wildwood Green Frost Delay Policy:

When the overnight temperature drops below freezing, there is a potential for a frost delay. If there is frost on the course the Superintendent will let the Golf Shop know what the revised starting time for the day will be as quickly as

possible, and we will inform you of any updates via E-Communication.

Once the Superintendent gives the Golf Shop the "all clear" to begin play, we will implement a forward shotgun for all play at and before the new starting time. We have a 45-minute minimum notification time, so if we get the goahead to open the course at 9:00am, the shotgun will begin at 9:45am to allow golfers time to get to the course.

Things to Keep in Mind:

• If frost on the course is ignored and regular play commences it will cause damage to the playing surface and make the grass susceptible to disease and weeds.

• Frost Delays also apply to the practice greens. We don't want to damage those!
