2025 Member Event Introduction

We have all sorts of golf and social events that will be fun for all! So, who is ready to play?

There have been several improvements to the facilities since 2017, with the **cost exceeding \$2,500,000**. The greens were converted from the aging bent grass to fantastic Champion Ultra Dwarf Bermuda. The roofs were replaced on the range building and the on-course bathroom facility. **The windows, as well as the front doors, were replaced in the clubhouse** and a full remodel was completed inside of the golf shop and Champions Grille. The steps to the back patio of the clubhouse and the front steps from the parking lot were repaired, and **an awning was added over the patio**. The pavilion was enclosed and over 300 trees were removed to help with sunlight for turf growth. **Irrigation improvements were made all over the course and the clubhouse grounds,** which will help tremendously in dry times of the year, and we are now fully automatic at our tees, greens, and fairways! **A new practice putting green was installed behind the driving range** and improvements to the landscaping were made around the clubhouse and throughout the course.

Over the next few years, we continued with our cart path improvement plan, replaced or installed new railroad ties and upgraded the facility with new landscaping and individual irrigation heads. We cleaned the pond at #5 green, cleaned the lake on #12 and enlarged the forward tee, removed more trees throughout the property, improved and enlarged the lesson tee area, added nets between the driving range and fairway of hole #1, cleaned some underbrush on the course, and developed a new scorecard. We added new, taller range nets along the Strickland Road-side of the driving range, removed the fairway bunker on #1, and expanded and added hitting area at our lesson tee.

In 2024 we renovated bunkers on the golf course, added new benches around the property, and continued to improve the playing areas. In 2025 we plan to finish bunker renovations, improve cart path edges and mass tree and limb removal. We are also investigating the possibility of installing an observation deck and a simulator bay with trackman capabilities. As you can see, there is a lot of work going on at Wildwood Green to improve our services and the experience of being a member!

We have many popular events scheduled this year which include a **Ryder Cup-style event**, a **Masters Par 3 event**, two Couples Events, PGA Pools ran in conjunction with the PGA Tour's **Major Events**, a **Superintendent's Revenge day**, and so much more. We hope everyone enjoys our robust member event schedule this year! See pages 7-9 for information regarding tournaments, handicapping, flights, and local rules to be sure you are well informed about how we execute our events.

Thank you so much for being a member at Wildwood Green Golf Club and please help us by continuing to fill out comment cards. Let us know how we can improve our events!

New W.G.G.C Points System

We will be implementing a new point system for our events. The purpose of this system is to give people who participate in Wildwood events an advantage when it comes to Member-Guest sign-ups. 70% of the Member Guest Field will be decided this way, the other 30% of the field will be selected via a non-weighted, equal value lottery. the For the weighted lottery, each kind of event will be given a point value. The points are not based on performance in the event but participation in the event. This system will run from the first event after the 2024 Member-Guest until the event before the 2025 Member-Guest. Each point will put your name into the hat for Member-Guest. (If you get 10 points your name will be in the hat 10 times)

<u>1 Point Events</u>	Medalist, Skins Day, Couples Golf, Parent Child
<u>2 Point Events</u>	All 1 Day Member-Members, Masters Par 3, Horse Race, Flag Day & Supers Revenge
<u>4 Point Events</u>	Spring Member-member, Club Championship, Ryder Cup & Fall Member-Member

<u>Tournament Information,</u> <u>Flighting Information, & Regulations</u>

Wildwood Green does NOT post scores for events.

Competition Tees: Each competitor's **set of tees** to be played will be assigned to the competitor based on the set of tees most commonly played from in their most recent handicap revision. In the event other courses have been played, the staff will assign a tee based on the other course's rating closest to that of a set of tees at Wildwood Green.

Event Flighting: Events will be flighted in the Spring & Fall Member-Member events, the Tournament of Champions event, and the Club Championship. For other club events, flights will depend on field size. When there are 15 or more teams or 30+ competitors, flights will be created and broken down as evenly as possible.

Flight Basis: When playing your own ball, flights will be determined by the low handicap index of the two/four-player team according to the most recent GHIN revision, either the 1st or the 15th of the month. War in the Woods Member Guest will use 12-month low indexes.

Handicap Indexes: The handicap index used for the event competitor will be the handicap index of each person on the day of the event signup deadline.

Handicap Allowances: *Please see the attached Appendix C document from the USGA regarding handicap allowances*

During **match play events**, each competitor will receive 85% of their course handicap and then the low course handicap will play as a **zero** and the higher course handicap will receive the difference in strokes.



Handicap Allowances

Handicap allowances are designed to provide equity for players of all levels of ability in each format of play over both 9 holes and 18 holes. *Handicap allowances* are applied to the *Course Handicap* as the final step in calculating a player's *Playing Handicap* (see Rule 6.1 Course Handicap Calculation and Rule 6.2 Playing Handicap Calculation).

The National Association is responsible for establishing *handicap allowances* or it can delegate this responsibility to a Regional Golf Association or *golf club*.

The following table sets out the recommended *handicap allowances* based on medium-sized field net events. The allowances may be adjusted based on field size and the desired equity (see Interpretation C/1):

Unless otherwise specified by the Committee, players with a 'plus' Playing Handicap give strokes back to the course, beginning at the hole with stroke index 18. For example, a player with a Playing Handicap of +2 would give strokes back to the course at the holes with stroke index 18 and 17. When handicap allowances are applied, a player with a plus Playing Handicap moves up towards zero including rounding. This is to maintain the same relative difference between Playing Handicaps.



Wildwood Green - Local Rules

WILDWOOD GREEN

<u>Specific Notes – Front Nine</u>

Hole #1: The driving range is considered out of bounds. White PVC pipe defines the out of bounds along the nets. **Hole #2:** Out of bounds runs the entire right-hand side of the hole and is marked with white stakes or white PVC pipe. When the creek(s) meets out of bounds, two stakes will be present. When there are two stakes present, both white and red, the line from red stake to red stake will define the end of the penalty area.

Hole #3: Out of bounds runs the entire right-hand side of the hole meeting a penalty area that begins at the backright hand corner of the hole behind the green. The penalty area extends into the woods towards #5 green and to the left towards #4 tee. When the penalty area meets out of bounds, two stakes will be present. When there are two stakes present, both white and red, the line from red stake to red stake will define the end of the penalty area. **Hole #5:** Penalty area begins near the tee and runs the length of the entire right side of the fairway and connects to out of bounds that starts at the green on the right side. The drain in-between #5 fairway and #13 fairway is deemed as ground under repair.

Hole #6: Out of bounds extends up the entire right side of the hole and connects to out of bounds at the back right corner of the hole. Directly behind the green is out of bounds marked with white PVC pipe that runs the length of the road/#7. For any balls hit into the water, there are two drop zones provided, one to the left of the green and one to the right. You should use the drop zone furthest away from the flag for any balls hit into the water.

Hole#8: The trees to the left of the fairway are considered a penalty area and are marked with red stakes. Out of bounds extends the entire right-hand side of the hole.

Hole #9: The trees to the right of the fairway are marked as out of bounds and extend up the right side of the hole and then behind the green and then to the left toward the houses. The houses are marked as out of bounds as well.

<u>Specific Notes – Back Nine</u>

Hole #10: The drainage ditch in between the 10^{th} and 18^{th} hole is deemed ground under repair. The drain next to the cart path in the middle of the fairway near the edge of the water is deemed as ground under repair. The rocks near the cart path behind the green are marked as hazard.

Hole #11: Out of bounds runs the entire right side of the hole towards the back right corner near the green. The creek behind the green is marked as a penalty area. When there are two stakes present, both white and red, the line from white PVC pipe to white PVC pipe will define the end of the penalty area.

Hole #12: The creek directly behind the tee box is marked as a penalty area and will extend up the right-hand side of the tee box towards the green until a red/white stake combination is present. Out of bounds extends up the right-hand side of the hole through the woods toward hole #13. For any ball hit into the water, there are two drop zones provided, one in the front of the green and one behind the green. You should use the drop zone furthest away from the flag for any balls hit into the water.

Hole #13: The drain in between #13 fairway and #5 fairway is deemed as ground under repair. The grouping of trees on the left side roughly 50 yards from the green are marked as a penalty area.

Hole #14: The drain between #14 fairway and #15 tee box is deemed as ground under repair. The drainage ditch near the cart path on the right side of the hole (roughly 50 yards from the green) is deemed as ground under repair. **Hole #16:** The drainage area to the left of the fairway in the trees is deemed as ground under repair.

Hole #18: The drain between the 10th and 18th fairways is deemed as ground under repair. The drainage ditch in between the 10th and 18th hole is deemed as ground under repair. The flower bed directly behind the green and to the left is a mandatory free drop.

Extra Local Rules Information

- Please do not probe for golf balls in our neighbor's yards and always respect their property.
- Out of Bounds is defined by white stakes, white PVC pipe, and by the inside edges of the street curb or the roads meandering through the neighborhood.
- Penalty areas are defined by red stakes and lines.
- Drop zones are provided on the following holes and are defined by white circles: #6 and #12. It is not mandatory to use a drop zone on either of these holes however, if the drop zone is not used, relief should be taken at the last point the golf ball entered the penalty area and/or by following all USGA guidelines.
- When a ball is hit into a mulched area it should be played as it lies. If the ball is in a maintained flower bed free relief is mandatory. Relief should be taken at the nearest point, no closer to the hole.

Any ball deemed to be lost or out of bounds may take stroke and distance relief or dropped on the edge of the fairway no closer to the hole with 2 penalty strokes (Local Rule E-5) **PLEASE NOTE: If a provisional ball is hit you will no longer be allowed to take the relief under Local Rule E-5.**

2025 Major Events

<u>Spring Member-Member</u> Saturday, May 10th – Sunday, May 11th

Wildwood Green will kick off the 2025 Majors with the Spring Member-Member. This is a two-person team event with a format of one gross plus one net. Flights will be determined by the low player's current handicap index. Teams can be made up of either men or women or a mixture of both. Course handicaps will be calculated based on the tee color played by each golfer. To accompany the championship matches there will be an optional team skins game and hat pool offered for the weekend. This first Major of the year is always a great value as the event features two days of competition. Be sure not to miss out on this exciting team competition and mark the date on your calendar now!

<u>War in the Woods</u> Friday, June 6th - Sunday, June 8th

Wildwood Green's Member-Guest saw a major renovation during 2022 and received the upmost praise for its value and enjoyability. A tournament focused on providing value and creating one of the most action-packed weekends of the year. This event consists of 60 two-person teams who compete in a flighted round-robin match play competition playing 45 holes over the course of two days. With a practice round, Calcutta, raffle, prizes, and special contests, this tournament is the place to be on June 20th -June 22nd!

<u>Club Championship</u> Saturday, August 2nd & Sunday, August 3rd

The most prestigious title at Wildwood Green must be the title of Club Champion. This two-day stroke play competition, which hosts the club's best golfers, will undoubtedly see great scores again in 2025. The Club Championship will be flighted by age and then by handicap. Flight size is solely dependent on how many people sign up in the age division. No handicap will be used in competition and men and women will compete in separate flights.

We will also host a net division Club Championship and anyone who has a GHIN handicap is allowed to compete in the net division. The men's net division will not be broken down into flights, and instead will be created with one flight. Everyone playing in the net division will use 95% percent of their course handicap. The difference in tee ratings will be factored into the handicaps. To be crowned the overall men's or women's champion, you MUST PLAY in the gross division, as we have no overall champion within the net division.

New in 2023, Wildwood Green added a **women's only net division** and any female who has a GHIN handicap is allowed to compete in the net division. The women's net division will be broken down into flights. The Women's Overall Division will be flighted as always. Women will not have to decide between one or the other, they can play in both.

<u>Ryder Cup Event</u>

Saturday, September 13th – Sunday, September 14th



Once a year, we host a Ryder Cup style golf tournament. The Ryder Cup is a 36-hole match play event which features two days of competition. This event will consist of 4 different matches played throughout two days, and 4 separate 9-hole competitions occur with players accumulating points for their team by winning or tying their match. The team with the most points after the completion of the four matches wins! In 2025 we will have 2 captains picking players for their team for a true Ryder Cup experience. We will do a live picking for teams and then the captains will also select the pairings for the matches on both days.

Fall Member-Member

Saturday, October 11th - Sunday, October 12th

Our highly anticipated and most popular event will be held in October. The format for the Fall Member-Member is five, nine-hole match play matches. There will be three matches played on Saturday and two matches played on Sunday. Teams can be made up of either men or women or a mixture of both. The two-person teams will be flighted according to the low player's current handicap index and each flight will have a max of 6, two person teams.

Each person will play their own ball for each hole. The lowest net score on each hole will win between the two teams. One point is available on each hole and one point for winning the match (10 points per nine holes). Holes may be halved, and a 9-hole match may end in a tie at 5 points for each team. The team with the most points after the five matches, from each flight, will compete in a sudden death playoff for the title of Overall Member-Member Champion. Also, just like the Spring Member-Member, we will offer a hat pool. Be sure to grab your partner and sign up early as this event always fills up quickly!



Carolinas Golf Association Events

The Carolinas are home to hundreds of golf tournaments each year that appeal to a wide range of skill levels. The CGA administers its own calendar of championships, considered one of the strongest tournament programs in the country, as well as USGA qualifiers for national events.

Whether you're a scratch golfer looking to qualify for the U.S. Open or Carolinas Amateur Championship, or a mid-level handicap wanting to participate in one of the CGA's individual or team events, there is an opportunity for you to play. These events are open to members of CGA Member Clubs who have up-to-date CGA/USGA handicap indexes.

The CGA annually conducts 48 championships and five team match competitions for men, women, juniors, and seniors. Please note that you are a member of the CGA with your paid GHIN handicap at Wildwood Green Golf Club.

The CGA conducts over 100 One-Day tournaments that are open to both men and women with a CGA membership and an up-to-date CGA/USGA handicap index from a CGA member club. In 2024, we plan to host the Jack Ratz Jr. Memorial, a CGA one-day event, and potentially a senior 4-ball event.

Match Play Championship

New to 2025, we will be restructuring our Match Play Championship. The new structure will be a multi-weekend event starting with an 18-hole qualifier on August 23rd, where the top 64 players will advance to the main event. The tournament spans three weekends: the first on September 27th with two rounds of match play starting in the morning and an afternoon session, followed by the second weekend on October 4th with two more rounds to narrow the field. The final round, scheduled for later, will determine the champions for both brackets through an 18-hole match. Spectators are welcome and encouraged, we will run food and beverage specials during the final match. For more information and details, follow the link below.

The drawing will occur at 4:00 PM each Friday throughout the year. There is one poker chip per membership in the bowl and each membership has been assigned a



(Participants must pay their **\$5 entry each week to be eligible to win.)** Each Friday when the chip is drawn, we will check the number on the chip and determine the corresponding membership. If the membership has paid their \$5 entry for that week, they win 50% of the pool. Each week Wildwood Green will take 50% of the entries and put into a capital dues improvement fund.



If the drawn membership did not pay their entry that week there is no winner, the money carries over to the next week. Members have the option to prepay their \$5 for as many weeks as they would like.

In 2019 we added benches throughout the course, and we installed an ice-water machine. In 2020, we purchased an additional ice-water machine for the halfway house. In 2021 we improved the patio & walkway by the driving range and purchased all new bag stands. We were also able to purchase cooler stands on the course. In 2022 we added and upgraded benches on the course as well as renovated the bunkers on hole #15. In 2023 we renovated 25 more bunkers on the golf course and practice facilities. In 2024 we continued bunker renovations, tree removal and tee box renovations.
